We have finally come to the end of a very busy term. On behalf of all the staff may we wish you a safe holiday with your children. Thank you to all who have helped in any way over the term. Without you, our school could not function in the way it does. It is always a delight to see so many parents in the school, helping in classrooms, assisting with excursions etc.

Changes to the School Day

Next term we will see some changes when the children return to school on <u>Tuesday 30th April</u>. The school day will alter and students will be expected to be at school ready to go into class at 8:45am. The following timetable will

An extra teacher has been placed on duty after school at the playground. Whilst we expect that the majority of our children will be collected promptly at 3:15pm we understand that for a few, parents will be unable to collect until 3:30pm as currently happens. For those children, they can remain on the grass/playground area, supervised by the teacher.

As we have staff meetings on Wednesday after school, it is helpful if all children are collected by that time. For those who are not, they will wait in the Front Office until parents arrive.

We have arranged with the City Council to change the times for operating the crossing lights. Arrangements have also been made for the bus students who in the main, will be able to catch an earlier bus. We may have 'teething' problems with the changes, but will work through any issues that arise.

Near Miss

Last week a staff member witnessed a 'near miss' between a car, a parent and child. What was upsetting is that the parent had crossed the road on Wehl Street only metres from the school crossing. Young children are influenced by adult behaviour and if they see adults not using a crossing, then they think this is OK to do so. We do not ever want to see anyone injured or killed outside of our school.

SMS Communication

Over recent times it has become obvious to us that the school needs a system to contact large groups of parents with simple messages quickly and easily. Reminders of student free days, reminder of early dismissal times, school camp arrival times are just some of the occasions we have needed to contact groups of parents. As such, we have been

Term 1 Visual Arts

This year we are privileged to have all classes enjoy specialist Visual Art lessons with Leanne Syron. Many concepts are being taught and learnt throughout the various year levels and are becoming more visible as displays go up around the school.
