

Dear Parents and Caregivers,
Term 1, Week 7, March 12th, 2015
Year 6 \& 7 Camps
I have just had the absolute delight and pleasure of accompanying our year 7 students on school camp to Canberra. The students, staff and parent helpers on the year 7 trip all agreed that it was a fantastic experience and the learning experiences that we participated in were well planned, engaging and highly informative. Over the four days we packed in trips to Australian War Memorial, Parliament House, Old Parliament House, National Gallery, Electoral Office, High Court of Australia, Regatta Point and Mount Ainslie. There was also time for fun and hands on learning at Questacon, Australian Institute of Sport and the Canberra Aquatics Centre. Our students had the opportunity to work with the education officers at each of the venues to listen to information about our history, government, citizenship, legal system and election processes as well as to participate in simulated hands on experiences. The year 6 students left on their camp on Monday morning and will return on Friday.

## External Review

In a previous newsletter information was included about the new DECD External School Reviews that replace the previous School Validations. All schools will be reviewed by officers from the DECD External Review Unit, Education Director and a Review Principal every four years. Validations were conducted every three years. Next week our school will participate in a 3 day review involving presentations, classroom visits, policy examination, teacher and student meetings and interviews.

## Sports Day

Sports Day will be held on Thursday $2^{\text {nd }}$ April which is immediately prior to the Easter Break. Over the past two years we have had cold, wet weather for most of term 4 and both times we have had to dodge the rain. By moving Sports Day to earlier in the year we are hoping for more pleasant weather. This will also provide an opportunity to hold time trials for senior students who go on to compete in SAPSASA Athletics and Cross Country in Term 2.
We are changing the format slightly this year to include whole school team games, sprits and relays after the lunch break that will be scored for team points as well as the usual tabloid format.
Governing Council will have barbeque food for sale and there will be prepaid pizza lunches by the Rotary Club of Mount Gambier West available. This year Governing Council will also be organising a café with slices, tea and coffee. Programs for the day will be sent home earlier to the date.

Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER)
Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the nation capital. Students have been given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.
The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of $\$ 60$ per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program, which we have already factored into the overall cost of the camp. ## ICAS) International Competitions \& Assesments for Schools

Your child is invited to take part in the ICAS in 2015 in any of the following subject areas
Please return the permission slip with full entry fee(s) to the Front Office no later than Monday 6th April.
The competitions take place every year in schools throughout Australia and South Pacific region. They provide an opportunity for students to measure their own achievement in an external assessment situation, and are a valuable experience. They are, however, voluntary, not compulsory, and we understand that there are many financial commitments which parents have at the beginning of the school year.
All students receive a Certificate and an individual results letter indicating which questions they answered correctly, as well as the average mark for their state. The documents are suitable for inclusion in a portfolio.
Certificates are awarded for each Year level as follows:

- High Distinction to the top $1 \%$ of entrants in the state
- Distinction to the next $10 \%$ entrants in the state
- $\quad$ Credit to the next $20 \%$ of entrants in the state
- Achievement to the students who are placed in the top $20 \%$ of their year level at their school, but do not qualify for one of the above certificates
- Participation to all students who do not qualify for one of the above certificates

Medals are awarded to top students in each year level in each state. The competitions are an initiative of the Educational Assessment Centre of the University of New South Wales.

## George Booker Pupil Free Day.

Recently staff spent the day with George Booker, a mathematics professor from Queensland. Every staff member at Reidy Park has their own textbook "Teaching Mathematics" which we use to plan our units of work. Staff spent the day listening to George outline the process children go through in mastering numeration. (Number). From working with George staff now have a greater awareness of how important it is not to "assume" a student understands place value or that they have an in depth understanding of base ten (in the old days we called it tens and units!!). We know that students need to be able to talk about numbers in a clear and efficient way which includes renaming numbers e.g. 132 is one hundred, 3 tens and 2 ones... It can also be 13 tens and 2 ones or even 132 ones!! You can expect to see children in J.P using ten frames on a daily basis. Children need to see numbers in many ways.


Improvement Plan team met to for 2015 should be. We have on basic number facts $R-7$. Basic number facts is the automatic recall of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts. Our work last year with Ann Baker will fit very nicely with this priority.
Knowing basic number facts will enable students to work with problem solving tasks and apply their thinking in authentic ways which is one of the demands they are faced with in NAPLAN testing.
