

Yellow Day

On Friday the 13th November, all classes will participate in a school wide fundraiser event that will be known as 'Yellow Day'. On this day students of all grades are asked to bring a gold coin and to dress in yellow. Half of the money raised will go to the cancer council in support of a music teacher who is loved throughout the school who has cancer: Miss Sue Mouat. The other half of the money will be sent to the Leukemia Foundation to assist younger children who are living with cancer, in support of a family at Reidy Park. Students are asked to come to school as if it was a normal day: packed lunch, recess, hat and a water bottle are still necessary.
