Room 9 News

In Room 9, we have been doing a science experiment over the week that includes cooling, heating and evaporating different liquids like cordial, milk, Italian dressing, orange juice, lemon squash and tomato sauce. We found out that the liquids have different properties because they freeze, cool and evaporate at different times. The cordial took 1 minute and 16 seconds to melt and the milk took 11 minutes and 2 seconds to melt. The key things that we needed included 2 foil trays, a candle and a freezer. First we had to pour the 6 liquids into an ice cube tray and then very carefully carry it down to the nearest freezer. We had to check on the ice cubes every 15 minutes and write down our observations on how the ice cubes were going and once the ice cubes were fully frozen we had to write down the time it took to freeze then get ready for the melting stage. For the melting stage we had to get a tea light candle and put it in a small, round foil tray and put a long, rectangle foil tray on top were the ice cubes will melt. We had to write down the time we started then the time it melted and how long it took to melt. After the first ice cube was fully melted we poured it onto a paper plate and drew around the liquid with a marker. Once all the ice cubes were done we left the ice cubes to evaporate. We checked it the next morning to find nearly all the ice cubes has evaporated a little except the tomato sauce. We discovered that heating and cooling different substances happens at different rates because of the different properties.
