Dear Parents and Caregivers,

An important building block for children's literacy and numeracy development is regular student attendance at school. We all want our students to get a great education and regular attendance is a crucial foundation for their success at school, both academically and socially. From the first day, every day counts. If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school. There is no safe number of days for missing school; six days absence per term from Junior Primary to the end of Year 7 equals approximately one year of missed schooling.

Another important feature of attendance is punctual arrival at school. The best learning time for children is the start of the school day so it is vital that students arrive on time to start their day with their peers. Not only does arriving on time support learning but it will also help students develop skills and attitudes that will help them to be successful later in life, these include punctuality, being organised and self-discipline. The school day starts at 8.45am and I would like to encourage all families to have children in classrooms on time as it sets them up to be successful learners. Whenever a student is away we require a written reason which gets documented in roll books. We are mandated to record lateness and absences; these are also reported to you in the mid-year and end of year reports.

2017 Planning

As mentioned in our previous newsletter, planning for class and staffing arrangements for 2017 has commenced. We need to identify teacher staffing/vacancies to ensure a smooth transition. If you know that your child will be leaving the school next year, or if

you know of anyone who will be starting, could you please let us know. Enrolments for next year are well underway and we have students on a waiting list that we need to inform soon regarding vacancies. Your assistance with this would be really appreciated.

Well done to those students.






Room 15 - Maths Rotations

Italian

This term in Italian the Reception classes have been busy learning their colours. The Years 1's are learning the names of farm animals and the things they eat. Year 3-5 students are focusing on sport action verbs incorporating the topic of the Olympics. Year 6/7s are learning to express preferences and choices in Italian by accepting or rejecting ideas, agreeing or disagree using simple questions, such as 'Ti piace? (Do you like?) Secondo Me (In my opinion) Preferici?' (What do you prefer?).

Last Friday Rooms 25 and 18 were the lucky classes to have a visit from some special guests during their Italian lesson. Grant High School are hosting 10 Italian exchange students from their Sister High School 'Massimo Alberini' in Treviso, Italy. The students are in Years 10-12 and in Australia for 10 days. Their visit was a great opportunity for our students to share what they have learnt, practise speaking in Italian, and experience listening to native Italian speakers.

The Reception students enjoyed making colourful 'fiori' flowers and the year 2 students created a mini book on the Olympic sport action verbs with them.


