Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This week's newsletter is our last for what has been a busy and productive term. There have been many highlights including class concerts, sporting events and student participation in other extra-curricular activities. This afternoon our Upper Primary students showcased their learning to the school and families by presenting the fantastic work that they have been doing around the theme of Ancient Civilisations. Next term will also be 'full' with many events scheduled including students from Yr 3 & 4 presenting their combined concert, Reception transition visits and Yr 7 Graduation.

I would like to commend both students and staff on their efforts throughout the term. Our teachers work hard to ensure Reidy Park is an environment focused on learning and high expectations and I am continually impressed and proud of our students who strive to achieve success in their school work and behave in a respectful manner.

Next term we will also begin the task of placing children in classes for 2018. This process is quite extensive as several factors are taken into consideration such as social and academic perspectives, gender balance and children with special needs. If parents believe they have information, based on educational needs, which will help in your child's placement, please put this information in a letter addressed to the Principal, marked 'Confidential'. We cannot guarantee that every request will be met, however the information will be taken into consideration. Students will also have the opportunity to be a part of this placement process and next term will be asked to identify friends they would like to be in a class with next year. Our school has done much work this year in building children's mindsets and they will be strongly encouraged to be resilient if they are not placed with a preferred friend (there is no guarantee that children will be placed with their 'best' friend/s as it is logistically impossible to achieve this outcome). We would value parent support in promoting the message that whilst friendships are important,

being in a new class is an opportunity to develop connections with other peers.

Volunteers

Our school benefits greatly from volunteers who provide support in a wide range of ways including coaching sporting teams, helping children in class activities, providing transport assistance, fundraising events and membership of parent groups such as Governing Council. It is a DECD requirement that all volunteers who provide ongoing assistance must participate in a Responding to Abuse and Neglect – Education and Care (RAN-EC) induction session. The RAN-EC induction outlines for volunteers their child protection responsibilities and provides guidelines on protective practices. Ongoing assistance by a volunteer can either be regular or irregular, this might mean:

- Once a week.
- Once a fortnight.
- Every day for a week/term.
- Once a term.
- Whenever it fits with other commitments.

Our school will be running a RAN-EC induction session for volunteers on Tuesday November 7th from 6.30pm-8.30pm in the school library. All current and intending

volunteers are strongly encouraged to attend. Please the complete reply slip in this week's newsletter if you would like to register for this session (there is no cost to participants).
