Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Many significant and important events will be occurring over the final few weeks of term. This includes our transition visits that will be held next week. On Wednesday and Thursday in Wk 8, our Yr 7 students will attend their nominated high school. Across the same days we will be hosting the kindy kids who will join Reidy Park as Reception students in 2018. Once transition days have been completed our attention will turn to preparing for our Carols evening on Wed December 13th. This is a wonderful whole school event and there are further details about the evening in this week's newsletter. The following night will see our Year 7 Graduation ceremony being held at Casadio Park.

2018 Planning

Our planning for 2018 classes is almost finalised. On the last day of term students will participate in a transition lesson whereby they will visit their new classroom and meet their teacher (if the teacher is currently working at our school). At the end of this day students will bring home a note that indicates their class placement details, including their teacher. We acknowledge that children will respond differently to this change. They have a strong sense of anticipation when new classes are announced and when they discover that they have not been placed with their 'best' friend there can be a sense of disappointment and sadness. Teachers have worked with their students this year to reinforce the importance of a range of dispositions and habits to support their learning, including developing a growth mindset and being resilient. The experience of transitioning into a new environment is a great way for students to build their awareness of these important life skills that they will need as adults. We ask that you support your child through this experience and frame it in a positive way.

End of Year Reports

End of Year reports will be sent home on Thursday December 14th. They will provide a summary of your child's

achievement for this semester. A student who receives a 'satisfactory' rating for their achievement is demonstrating what is expected at their year level, with the grade equivalent being a C. Students who are working above what is expected for their level will receive an excellent or good rating, the equivalent of an A or B grade respectively. Students who have yet to achieve their year level standard will have demonstrated minimal (D) or partial (E) achievement. A further description of the broad skills evident at each achievement level has been provided in this week's newsletter.

Bushfire Season Information

As we approach summer it is important that all families are aware of our school's planning for this type of emergency. Our school has been rated as low risk in terms of exposure to bushfire incidents. However, we still have emergency plans in place if a bushfire situation directly impacts our school. You may be aware that on some days when the weather is forecast to be 'catastrophic' that some schools will be directed to close. Please be aware that this scenario does not apply to Reidy Park and that we will maintain normal school routines despite this type of forecast. If an excursion has been planned on a day where there is a designated fire ban, a risk assessment will be undertaken to determine if it goes ahead. A pamphlet has been provided in this week's newsletter that provides further information on this matter.

Robogals

Monday the 20th of November, Robogals representatives from UniSA in Adelaide came to Reidy Park to work with year 4-6 girls from Rooms 5-13. The aim of the sessions was to engage young girls in STEM learning and in particular robotics and engineering. In the sessions we programmed a robot to do simple tasks such as coding the robot to make it travel in a square shape. We did this by entering simple instructions into the computer. Next, we activated the sensors which were located underneath the robot. Towards the end of the session, we battled 1 v 1 robots on a flat platform. Each robot had a sharp skewer and a small balloon attached to the robot and we coded the robots to try and pop each other's balloons in a jousting like way. While we have a have an emergency and bushfire response plan for our site it is important that we are all prepared for a bushfire emergency.

Parent and family checklist

We all need to be ready for the fire danger season and to keep your children as safe as possible please ensure you:

download a copy of the *Bushfire and Your Child's School or Preschool* brochure from the DECD Bushfire and Emergency Management



- read all of the bushfire information provided to you
- talk with your children about what will happen if a bushfire occurs when they are at school or preschool
- update your emergency contact details with us before the start of the fire danger season
- make a personal Bushfire Survival Plan for your family and let us know if this will affect your child's attendance

 download the AlertSA app if you use a smart phone or bookmark the website on your computer.

'Catastrophic' fire danger days

'Catastrophic' fire danger days occur when conditions are the worst for a bush or grass fire. If a fire starts and takes hold on a 'catastrophic' day it will be extremely difficult to control.

Find out about site closures

Emergency school closures will soon appear on the governments Alerts SA website and mobile app. By downloading the Alert SA app to your mobile device you will be able to obtain real-time information and warnings.



If a bushfire approaches us

The safety of children in our care is our highest priority if a bushfire approaches our site.

We have a designated building or area, which has been identified as the safest or most suitable place for staff and students to be in this situation. Evacuation is our last option unless advised otherwise by emergency services.

When we move to our safe place we:

- move everybody inside, close windows, doors, and turn off the air conditioning
- fill available containers with water
- turn on any sprinklers and irrigation systems if it is safe and time permits
- remain inside with the children until the main firefront passes
- listen to local radio or monitor the CFS or AlertSA website for bushfire updates and information
- liaise with DECD Security and Emergency Management team and the CFS to stay informed about changing conditions.
