Dear Parents and Caregivers

Welcome back to the start of Term 2. All students have settled back into their class routines which has been pleasing to see and we are looking forward to another positive term ahead. As expected, there are many interesting events and activities that will occur during the term, including the commencement of Auskick (Week 2), the Year 2 concert (Week 4) and the Year 6 & 7 Musical (Week 7).

Thank you to everyone who was able to come along and support our Sports Day at the end of last term. The weather was fantastic and all students are to be congratulated on striving for their best and showing great enthusiasm throughout the day. A thank you is also offered to several others who contributed to the success of the day: Mr McShane and Ms Cliff for helping students prepare and coordinating the planning of the events, our Sports Day Captains for their great job with assisting their team and the parent helpers who managed the food stalls. We also had a number of Yr 8 students from Mt Gambier High School who provided help in running the events.

On Monday our pupil free day involved our staff, along with teachers from Penola and Newberry Park Primary Schools, working with Maths consultant Ann Baker as a part of our ongoing partnership with her. During the day staff looked at several key concepts that closely connected with our current school priorities including designing challenging problem solving tasks and differentiating work for students. The opportunity to network with teachers from other schools was also helpful.

External School Review

The school has received the final copy of the report compiled by the review team as a result of last term's external review. The report summarises a range of positive aspects that are present within the school as well as some recommendations for future action. These recommendations complement our current school priorities and will be areas of focus over the next few years. Some of the areas that were highlighted as

strengths include:

- Students have high expectations of each other and are able to talk about their learning confidently.
- The existence of positive levels of trust within the broader school community.
- Teachers genuinely want to support students do their best and willingly undertake and share professional learning.
- The school has a positive culture and is well placed to take the next steps to work on the recommendations.
