Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome to Term 3. Students have settled very well into their class routines and learning which has been pleasing to see. We are looking forward to another busy term ahead, including two class concerts; the Reception and Year 1 concert will be held next week and later in the term the Year 5 students will also be performing.

Staffing News

Two of our Front Office staff, Tracy Kain and Judy Hunter are on leave for the first 4 weeks of this term. The office will be staffed by Trish Lynch and Janine Duke (and Nat Morony) during this time. At the end of last term we farewelled Julie-Ann Sams, Rm 21 teacher. This class will be taught by Ms Suggate who is returning from maternity leave and Ms Rhiannon Ashby. Next week Mrs Johnson will also be taking leave for the remainder of the term. During this time Ms Vennessa James will be taking JP Performing Arts lessons.

School Improvement

A key part of our school improvement actions is to increase student achievement in reading. This semester staff will be looking more deeply into the teaching of reading to build upon our current teaching practices in this area. A specific strategy that will be explored is Guided Reading.

Guided Reading is a practice that involves teachers supporting a small group of students to read a text independently. The main goal of Guided Reading is to help students use reading strategies whilst reading independently. The teacher guides their students as they read a text. This can include:

- Introducing new vocabulary.
- Highlighting the language structures of a text.
- Focusing on fluency.
- Teaching a comprehension strategy.

Through students having the opportunity to talk, think and read their way through a text (with both their teacher and peers), they strengthen their reading skills and develop greater reading independence. Further information about Guided Reading will be shared throughout the term.

Another important reading improvement strategy that will occur this term is the Department for Education's Year 1 Phonics Check. The development of phonics knowledge and skills is an integral part of learning to read for younger students. The screening check is not a reading test but rather a short assessment designed to assess a student's ability to decode letter sounds (phonics). The test takes 5-7 minutes to complete and will be carried out by class teachers with each individual student. Teachers will then analyse the results and if necessary, make adjustments to their teaching program to support student learning. If you

have any concerns, or would like further information on how to best support your child's reading development, please speak to their class teacher.

Advanced Notice: The Tour of the Great South Coast Road Cycling Classic

The Tour of the Great South Coast Road Cycling Classic will impact traffic around our school on Tuesday August 27th. The course that will be coming past our school is as follows: STAGE TWO - Blue Lake Road Race (10 laps of 6.5km circuit - 65kms)

Route: O'Halloran Terrace, Wehl Street South, Lake Terrace West, Bay Road and John Watson Drive.

Race start: 1.30 p.m. Race finish: 3.00 p.m.

Road closures: 12:00 noon. - 4.00 p.m.

The roads will be closed to all vehicular traffic during these times and there will be disruption to after school pickup as O'Halloran Terrace and Wehl Street will be closed. In the interest of the students' safety we ask that you arrange an alternative after school pick up spot on Wednesday afternoon.

We are pleased to announce the appointment of our new


