DIARY DATES

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Today we had our annual Book Week celebration. Book Week is an initiative of the Children's Book Council of Australia and is aimed at promoting reading. Whilst this whole school event provides a fun opportunity to acknowledge the influence books have on our lives, including the bonding experience it provides for both child and adult, it also allows us to reflect on the importance of reading and its impact on learning. Numerous studies have shown that regular reading is linked to improved performance in various academic areas such as general knowledge, vocabulary, spelling and reading comprehension. This evidence highlights that one of the best things we can do to support children's learning is to find regular time to read with them. In regards to today's parade, we encourage family members who were present to show discretion if posting photos on social media to ensure only your child is recognisable.

Next week we look forward to the Year 5 concert to be held at the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre. The title of their concert is The Magic Telescope. Good luck to all students involved. Also next week, starting on Monday, solar panels will be installed on the gym roof. Pedestrian entry and exit points near the gym will still be accessible however students catching the bus in the afternoon will need to wait near the Library as the normal waiting area on the grass will be fenced off.

Term 3 Interviews

Families are encouraged to arrange a time for a parentteacher interview over the next few weeks. Term 3 parentteacher interviews are an opportunity for families to get an update on how their child is progressing and identify potential areas of focus for the remainder of the year. As these interviews are optional, the online booking system used in Term 1 won't be available; parents/caregivers are required to make direct contact with class teachers to arrange a date and time.

Term 4 School Carols Evening

At our most recent Governing Council meeting the starting time of this event was discussed. During the 2018 carols, community feedback was sought via a survey regarding this aspect of the evening. The outcome of the Governing Council discussion was for the carols evening to start at an earlier time this year: 6.30pm (last year the start time was 7.45pm). It is hoped that the earlier start time will support and encourage families to stay until the conclusion.

Student Safety

Student safety is of upmost priority at Reidy Park and we strive to ensure processes are in place so that our school is a safe environment. A number of these arrangements are dependent on family and caregiver support in the following areas:

After school pick up: It has been noticed that there have been a number of students staying after dismissal time at the end of the day to play on the playground. Please be aware that this is not appropriate and we request all families collect their children from school in a timely manner. Students are only allowed to be on the playground if they are supervised by a parent/caregiver.

Visitors: All visitors to the school, including parents and caregivers, need to report to the Front Office.

Bus students: If your child catches a bus after school please reinforce to them the importance of waiting in the appropriate area (the side of the Library or grass space adjoining the gym). Students need to go to this area immediately after dismissal time and wait for the bus.

These guidelines are in place to make sure our school is a

safe place for everyone and we thank you in advance for your support in these areas.

Cycling Event: Tuesday August 27th

The Tour of the Great South Coast Road Cycling Classic will impact traffic around our school on Tuesday August 27th. The course that will be coming past our school is as follows:

Blue Lake Road Race (10 laps of 6.5km circuit - 65kms) Route: O'Halloran Terrace, Wehl Street South, Lake Terrace West, Bay Road and John Watson Drive. Race start: 1.30 p.m. Race finish: 3.00 p.m. Road closures: 12:00 noon. – 4.00 p.m.

The roads will be closed to all vehicular traffic during these times and there will be disruption to after school pickup as O'Halloran Terrace and Wehl Street will be closed. In the interest of the students' safety we ask that you arrange an alternative after school pick up spot on Tuesday afternoon. Yard duty staff will escort students, if needed, to buses that will pick them up on Shepherdson Road after school on this day.

Bee Bots in Maths and Digital Tech

Over the last few weeks Room 25 have explored using our school BeeBots, a device that can be coded to make it move in different directions. We planned where we wanted to send our BeeBots and then tested this to see if we could make them follow the path. By using the BeeBots, we strengthened our skills of positional language. We also discussed how these work, which buttons are used and how we can program them to go on our path. It was very tricky to explain to each other what we were doing, but with lots of practice and persistence we showed improvement.



Friday 9th August thirty five year 6/7 Reidy Park students travelled to the Icehouse to participate in a District Basketball Carnival against other schools in our area. We entered three teams in the boys division and two in the girls.
