Acknowledgment of Country

We promise to thank them by taking care of the land everyday as we learn at Reidy Park Primary School.

Welcome Back

Welcome back to Term 4. We are looking forward to a positive and busy term ahead, with many activities to look forward to including transition days (for both yr 7s moving to high school and new reception students starting at our school next year), modified sports day, Book Week, yr 7 Graduation, end of year reports, SAPSASA Athletics and our carols evening. Some of these events will require restrictions and social distancing guidelines. We are in the process of finalising what these restrictions will look like and how we may be able to accommodate spectators at some events. 2021 Class Planning

From this term, our school will be starting the process of student placement in classrooms for 2021. Students also have the opportunity to be a part of the class arrangement process and will be asked to identify friends that they would like to be in a class with next year. This information will be sent home for you to discuss with your child and is also due by Monday October 26th. Whilst the intended purpose of having students nominate peers to be placed with next year is to support their transition into a new class, we also encourage families to use this as an opportunity to support their children to apply important life skills such as being resilient and accepting of change. We encourage all children to be optimistic about building friendships with a broad group of people.

Student Free Days

Wednesday 21st and Thursday 22nd October – Berry Street training

After having to postpone this training in term 1 due to Covid-19, All Reidy Park staff will be attending Berry Street training next week. The Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) is a practical approach to teaching and learning that enables teachers to increase engagement with students with complex, unmet learning needs and successfully improve all students' self-regulation, growth and academic achievement.

This training will compliment and provide valuable learning linking our work around student wellbeing and our positive behaviour support policy and expectations.

Although the Mount Gambier Show has been cancelled our approved School Closure Day on Friday 23rd of October will go ahead.

Behaviour Expectations

Towards the end of last term staff discussed highlighting a set of student behaviour expectations during term 4. We titled this our Term 4 Behaviour Non-Negotiables. All teachers have shared these with the students and will be having regular discussions around these expectations. The expectations fit within our school values or Care, Courage and Respect:

- Wear school uniform
- I keep my hands, body, feet and objects to myself
- Be in the classroom during learning time
- Place rubbish into bins
- I listen to and follow all directions
- Always use language appropriate for school
- Work hard, be kind, be safe

To accompany this we have also streamlined and come to a consistent agreement on our inappropriate behaviour process.

Term 4 Uniform Expectations

A reminder that all students need to wear a navy blue, broad brimmed hat during play times this term. Students without a hat will need to stay on the bench seats in the quad under cover during play times. Please be aware that it is an expectation that these hats are in a neat condition and we request your support in ensuring your child's hat does not have: texta writing, graffiti or rips/tears. If this is the case we will ask that a new hat is provided. A further expectation is that all shorts need to be plain navy blue and be an appropriate length: 'short' shorts are not appropriate.
