# **Professional Learning - Berry Street Training**

All staff (teaching and SSO) participated in the first two days of Berry Street training on Wednesday 21st and Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> October. The Berry Street Education Model will be implemented across the school and form the basis for our wellbeing focus moving forward. The Berry Street Education Model combines approaches addressed in trauma-informed classroom with proven positive psychology interventions. It is a practical approach to teaching and learning that enables teachers to increase engagement with students with complex, unmet learning needs and successfully improve all students' selfregulation, growth and academic achievement. The first two days of the training focussed on the elements of body and relationships. This training will complement and provide valuable learning linking our work around student wellbeing and our positive behaviour support policy and expectations. Days 3 and 4 of the Berry Street training will be held in 2021. Dates are to be confirmed.



# Room 16 - Mission Moon

Last term the students in Room 16 inquiry unit was based around Science and Design and Technologies. We called it Mission Moon. During this unit, the children learnt about the Earths resources and how we could find/recreate these resources on the Moon. They used Lego and the We-Do Lego robotic hardware and software each week to work through problems of living on the moon e.g. when learning about energy, we made solar panels to collect the sun's rays and these panels moved with the sun. They then built a rocket to fly them to the moon and created a moon base that showed at least one solution to a problem of living on the moon.
