It was a great day.






Canteen Service

Volleyball

The focus for our SRC students over the year has been reducing rubbish and litter at our school. We started this journey by doing an audit of the rubbish and waste found out in the yard over a few weeks, we then sorted what we found into reduce and avoid, reuse, recycle and compost. Here is what we found:

- Over 200 pieces of reduce and avoid rubbish were collected. This is rubbish like chip and muesli wrappers and plastic bags.
- Over 30 pieces of reusable items, these are things like pencils, rubbers, paper books
- Over 20 pieces of recyclable items which are things like yoghurt containers, lunch order paper bags and alfoil
- 26 pieces of compostable rubbish like food. We found this interesting as there are already compost bins outside.

As a way of helping reduce this the SRC are going to hold a Wipe out Waste/Nude Food day on Thursday's of weeks 6-9. On these days it is encouraged that students bring their food with as little packaging as possible, we have put together a list of tips that may be helpful:

- Take food out of packets at home
- Put food into small containers or straight into lunchboxes
- Take food out of the wrappers and put it in your classroom bins before going out to play
- Put food into paper bags that can be put straight into recycling



Aboriginal Survival Technology

On Tuesday and Wednesday this week all students participated in an Aboriginal Survival Technology incursion. Philip 'Wildman' Green wowed the students with a huge display of artifacts, photographs and amazing facts about how Aboriginal people traditionally lived using water, fire, clothing, hunting, medicine, weapons, bush tucker, tools and utensils.
